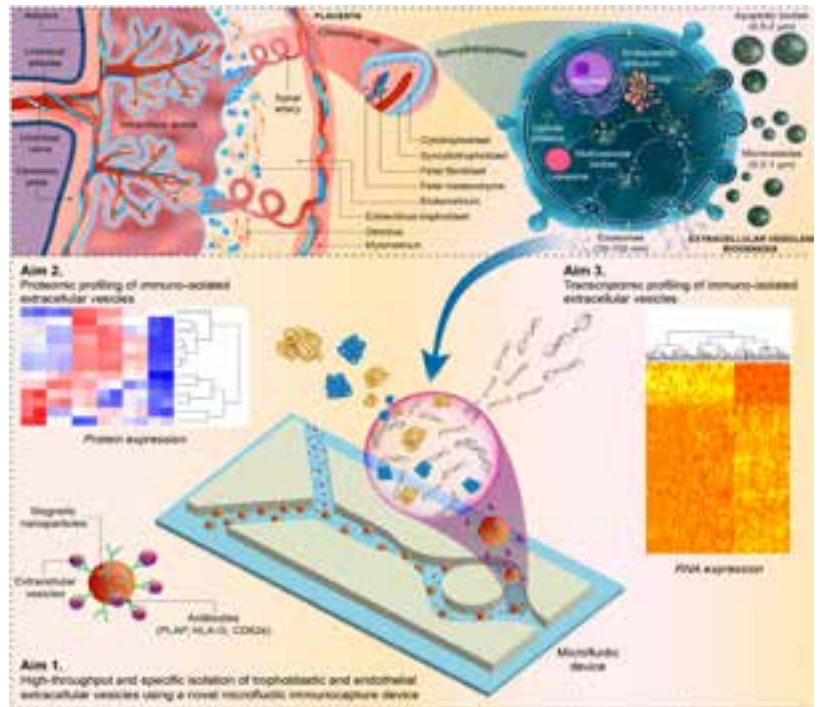
## Entries

**Open:** 1 - 30 August 2020

Please include the following information along with your application:

- Name
- Your Node
- Title of your design
- A summary of your work – 50 words or less

**Winners announced:** 2 October 2020



Please submit the full Adobe Illustrator file (\*.ai) or scalable vector graphics file (\*.svg – ensure that 'Preserve Illustrator Editing Capabilities' is turned on when saving as an SVG file) of your creation to [Ms Samantha Snowden-Finch](#) by the end of **Sunday 30 August 2020**

## How do I enter?

Make a diagram or image describing your research (or an aspect of it) that is effective in communicating that idea to a broad audience (scientific and general public). The design must be a vector graphic using either Inkscape or Adobe Illustrator.

## How does it work?

A judging panel will select an overall winner from all entries. The winning entry will receive a Visa gift card worth \$150. A "People's Choice Award" will give all members the chance to vote for their favourite design. This winner will receive a gift card worth \$50. Winners will be invited to receive their award at the 2020 CBNS Annual Research Workshop, with the cost of accommodation to be covered by CBNS. CBNS will feature the two winning entries in the 2020 Annual Report, with attribution to the creators.

## Judging Criteria

1. The creativity of the design – How unique is the design?
2. Use of design elements
3. Ingenuity – degree of tricks used
4. The effectiveness of science communication – How easy is it for the judges to grasp the concept of your work?

If you are unable to attend the CBNS Annual Research Workshop, your CI will collect your prize for you.
